Introduction

Nigeria despite its rich natural and human resources has been unable to realise its vast potential, due in large part to corruption, impunity and lack of accountability. These have posed major governance challenges, stifling development and compromising the social contract between the government and its citizens.

The On Nigeria programme is therefore targeted at promoting accountability, transparency and good governance in Nigeria by reducing retail corruption and strengthening Nigerian-led anti corruption efforts.

The Education Partnership (TEP) Centre and the Human Development Initiatives (HDI) with support from MacArthur Foundation have been commissioned to track the utilization of the Universal Basic Education (UBE) funds in Lagos State in order to improve public sector accountability and transparency.

In line with this mandate, this Lagos SUBEB 2019 action plan was simplified for education stakeholders at community levels to equip them with information to assess the relevance and effectiveness of UBE interventions and carry out effective course correction and advocacy.

Overview of the UBE Programme

The Universal Basic Education (UBE) is a nine-year programme established by the Federal Government of Nigeria to eradicate illiteracy and ignorance by creating the foundation for skills acquisition and knowledge required for life-long learning. The UBE programme took off effectively with the signing of the UBE Act in May 2004. However, implementation started in earnest in July 2005 with the appropriation of funds to the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) and subsequent disbursements to states. The implementation of the UBE programme resides with the state governments in conformity with provision(s) of the 1999 Constitution, and relevant sections of the UBE Act 2004.

The Main Objectives of the UBE Programme

According to the implementation guidelines released by the Federal Ministry of Education, in February 2000, the programme aims at achieving the following objective to;

- Develop in the entire citizenry, a strong consciousness for education and a strong commitment to its vigorous promotion.
- Provide free and compulsory universal basic education for every Nigerian child of school age group.
- Reduce drastically drop outs from the formal school system through improved relevance and efficiency.
- Cater for drop outs and out-of-school children/adolescents through various forms of complementary approaches to the provision and promotion of basic education.
- Ensure the acquisition of the appropriate levels of literacy, manipulative and life skills, as well as the ethical morals and civic values needed for laying the foundation for life-long learning.

Sources of Funding for the UBE Programme

In order to facilitate and sustain the UBE programme, the enabling law, UBE Act 2004, has provided sources of funds for the programme. Part III, Section 11 sub-section 1 of the UBE Act stipulates that:

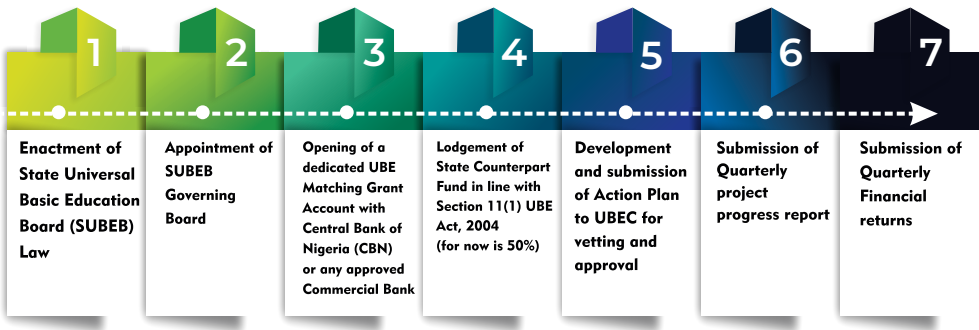

Guidelines for Accessing the UBE Matching Grant

The UBE matching grant constitutes 70% of the 20% Consolidated Revenue Fund (CRF). It was established to assist states in providing educational infrastructure for basic education. States are therefore required to provide counterpart funding (i.e 50% of the required amount) to access the UBE matching grants.

UBE Matching Grant

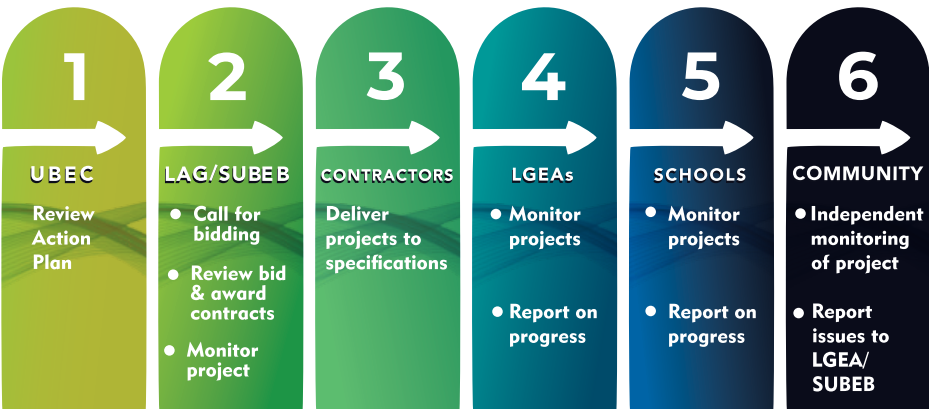


Disbursement Summary for Lagos State

The matching grant is meant for school infrastructural development. During the period of 2005-2019, the total sum of N13,513,430,533.21 allocated to Lagos State by the Universal Basic Education Commission, has been accessed and equally matched with the same amount putting the total expenditure on infrastructure by Lagos State SUBEB from 2005-2019, at N27,026,861,006.42.

Action Plan

The action plan is essential document prepared annually by the State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB) as part of the requirement for accessing the UBE matching grant from the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC). It is a comprehensive document that describes in detail intervention projects and activities proposed to be implemented in Early Childhood Care Development and Education (ECCDE), primary and junior secondary schools across the state.

This document usually specifies the beneficiary local government education area of intervention and schools, including description, duration of execution, quantity, unit costs and total costs of proposed projects

Why You Need to Know About the Action Plan

The action plan is a document that should be made public record for all citizens. The action plan will help citizens to be better informed of UBE interventions in their communities and improve their ability to monitor these interventions. Ultimately, citizens who are better informed are better positioned to demand transparent public service delivery. Therefore, you should know about the action plan so you can;

1

Improve the effectiveness of service delivery in your community by utilizing the action plan as an evidence for inclusive deliberation, consensus, and collective wisdom, resulting in better decision making with government stakeholders.

2

Strengthening accountability and transparency in the utilization of UBE Funds.

3

Promote inclusion of undeserved communities in UBE project allocation.

4

Support project monitoring and checkmate the use of substandard materials for infrastructural projects which could endanger the lives of the pupils in your community.

5

Discourage abandonment of infrastructural project by contractors.

6

As a public official use citizen engagement to elicit specific indigenous knowledge to help them tailor government intervention projects to the specific needs of the community.
