Universal Basic Education (UBE) is an education reform programme of the Federal Government of Nigeria which is designed to provide free, compulsory and continuous nine-year education for all school aged children, in addition to a mandatory year of Early Childhood Care, Development and Education (ECCDE). UBE funds are generated by state governments and matched by an intervention fund provided by the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) which coordinates the implementation of the UBE programme at state and local government level.

The ON Nigeria Transparency and Accountability Programme

The ON Nigeria project aims to track the utilisation of the UBE counterpart funds in Lagos state schools and strengthen the monitoring capacities of the Lagos State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB). The Education Partnership (TEP) Centre, supported by MacArthur Foundation, coordinates the monitoring of the UBE matching grant funded projects in nine (9) local government areas in consonance with the annual Lagos SUBEB action plan.



PROJECT SUMMARY

The Education Partnership (TEP) Centre, supported by MacArthur Foundation monitored the implementation of the 2015-2017 action plans in 9 Local Government Areas which are Alimosho, Badagry, Epe, Ifako, Ikeja, Ikorodu, Lagos Mainland, Oshodi-Isolo, and Somolu.

The data in this monitoring report was collected by TEP Centre volunteers selected from within each local government who have been trained in the monitoring of projects across Lagos state.






Fig 1d Furniture distribution breakdown for 2015











Fig 2d Furniture distribution breakdown for 2015










Fig 3b Summary of Furniture Distribution






Fig 3d Furniture distribution breakdown for 2015

Fig 3f Furniture distribution breakdown for 2017




Fig 3g Summary of furniture distribution for 2015-2017










Fig 4d Furniture distribution breakdown for 2015






Fig 4g Summary of furniture distribution for 2015-2017








Fig 5g Summary of furniture distribution for 2015-2017











Fig 6g Summary of furniture distribution from 2015-2017




Fig 7b Summary of Furniture Distribution

Construction Project Breakdown






Fig 7g Summary of furniture distribution from 2015-2017








Fig 8d Furniture distribution breakdown for 2015




Fig 8g Summary of furniture distribution from 2015-2017





Fig 9b Summary of Furniture Distribution









Fig 9f Furniture distribution breakdown for 2017




Fig 9g Summary of furniture distribution from 2015-2017




Potential Financial Leakages

In line with the objective of the UBE funds tracking programme to promote accountability and transparency, this section shows financial leakages through diversion, abandonment, sub-standard projects, non-delivery or demolition of projects. In addition to the aforementioned, Lagos state loses UBE financial resources through: unrealistic quotation by contractors, use of substandard materials for construction and furniture projects, inadequate monitoring of the construction process which leads to negligence and substandard delivery of UBE projects.

Therefore, in a bid to support Lagos SUBEB's anti-corruption efforts, Figure 10 below highlights the estimated financial loss incurred by the state due to the factors identified above. The figure depicts the financial estimates of abandoned, diverted, unimplemented projects in the local governments monitored by TEP Centre.

Methodology for Estimating Financial Leakages

The financial data was sourced from the quoted amounts contained in the approved Lagos state SUBEB 2015 - 2017 action plans. Financial leakages were estimated by adding the costs for all *abandoned*, *diverted* and *unimplemented* projects, as well as the costs of *undelivered furniture* incidences observed across all nine LGAs where TEP Centre is monitoring.



Call to Action

- Demand from Lagos SUBEB the publication of their action plans, financial reports, and procurement contract award procedure on e-portals, national newspapers using letter, SMS, E-mails and phone calls.
- Use the information in this booklet to monitor and track UBE projects to be implemented in your community to ensure quality and timely delivery of projects.
- Make enquires about projects that have been abandoned, demolished and dilapidating, using the letter template below and engage government as regards education project.
